The past year or so has been a challenge in so many ways. We want to thank the staff in our school district for the many things they have done to continually change and adapt to these challenging times, while maintaining an incredible focus on the health and social/emotional well-being of our kids...in addition to the focus on their education!



While schooling was a bit different during the 2020 – 2021 school year, the needs of our teachers remained...in fact, the need to be more innovative in teaching programs and materials has arguably increased. The Foundation remains committed to support them however we can, which means that we continue to raise money wherever possible. In past years, we have been able to coordinate community-based fundraisers.... events that brought people together to have fun and support a common cause. In consideration of Covid-19 and the many restrictions on getting together in large groups, we held our first virtual fundraiser, with our Cinco de Mayo split-the pot raffle event. It didn't bring us together in person, but it brought many of us together in spirit, as we had several people forgo buying raffle tickets and simply chose to donate to support our grants. Net ticket sales totaled just over \$13,000, so the split-the-pot ended up being a distribution of \$6,500 to the Foundation and \$6,500 to one lucky winner...Kelly Zurek of Lemont! In addition to the raffle split, we received additional donations which increased our fundraising total to almost \$8,000 to help support grants for innovative projects in our school district.

The 2020 - 2021 school year was also my first as President, and we gained new members Tom Boyle and John Parde, both parents and Lemont residents. A huge Thank You goes to our other board members, Dr. David Rupert, Laura Harkness and Nicole Friscia. At a time when we all struggled with work, school and family commitments, they all continue to volunteer their time and efforts to help support our cause.
